JULY BOARD BRIEFS

Too Hot! Run for Shade!

July and August are the hottest months of the year. And yes, for the title, I borrowed a couple of lyrics from Kool & the Gang's 1979 hit song, "Too Hot!". Not only is it important to run for shade, but it's critical that those of us of a "certain" age stay well-hydrated when the temperatures are sizzling hot. Be sure to bring your water along with you to the outdoor pool, the sports courts, golf course, walking trails, and other outdoor activities available to us all at Heritage Hunt.

On the roads again, just can't wait to get on the roads again. The Board approved the resolutions to re-mill and re-pave the roads, as well as the asphalt walking trails this summer. As of this writing, we do not know the schedule of events. That information will come later as we know more. With this massive community-wide project will come inconveniences, such as parking issues, detours, and so forth. CAMP is charged with communicating road closures to residents on an ongoing basis. Expect to see and hear frequent messages from CAMP through the eComm, HHTV, T-communicator, and other forms of communication throughout the project. Not signed up for the eComm? You probably noticed that the re-sprigging project on a few areas of the golf course was delayed due to the wet weather. It was too wet from heavy rains to re-sprig as planned. The heavy equipment needed to re-sprig would have damaged the turf and therefore the project was delayed until June 30 or July 7, if it is needed to be rescheduled again. Landscapes Golf Management is keeping a watchful eye and will update the community and the golfers as the project moves forward.

Be sure to attend the Board of Directors open meeting on the 2025 2nd quarter financial review and discussion on July 22. The meeting is scheduled for 4:00 - 5:00 pm in the Mountain View Room. Afterward, there is a Meet and Greet Social with the Board from 5:30 - 6:30 pm in the Clubhouse Blue Ridge Room.

As we heard last fall, Wil Washington from

Chadwick Washington stated that their law firm was unable to participate in the HOA's defense of the Department of Justice Paycheck Protection Program loan matter because they were the HOA's attorneys of record in 2020. Chadwick Washington remains a material witness in this matter. They specifically recommended to the Board that we hire specialized legal counsel. Our new attorneys, Crowell and Moring, who were hired to defend the HOA on the DOJ investigation of the PPP loan is continuing to review the case, the facts, and the law.

"Ssssmokin!" Jim Carrey's exclamation to describe himself in the 1994 movie, "The Mask" seems very appropriate as we enter July. CulinArt will be smokin' and cookin' up a hot, hot, hot Fourth of July Picnic to be held on the Clubhouse Knoll. There will be a large tent with outdoor seating as well as tables and chairs set up inside the Clubhouse in case the heat is too unbearable for some of us. Like last year's picnic, CulinArt is bringing in a smoker for smoked meats that we savor. Residents and their guests can sign up early for a discounted price for the picnic. How can we prepare to help ourselves and our neighbors in an emergency.

The July birth flowers are the Larkspur and the Water lily.

Historical Events:

Declaration of Independence:

July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence, declaring the 13 American colonies independent from Great Britain.

Moon Landing:

July 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong's famous "one giant leap".

July 4th: A day of great celebration. However, I look at it, as a time of great caution:

- Hurricanes
- Fireworks
- Hot Dogs
- Hot Sidewalks



The 2025 Atlantic hurricane season, officially began on June 1st, is predicted to be above-average. NOAA forecasts 13 to 19 named storms, 6 to 10 are expected to become

hurricanes, including 3 to 5 major hurricanes.

Hurricane preparedness:

- Extra flashlights (Do not use candles.)
- First aid kits
- Back up batteries
- 3 day supply of food and water (1 gallon/day)

Fireworks:

Enjoy fireworks on TV or community displays run by professionals.

Sparklers are very popular to use for celebrating the 4th. Sparklers, typically, burn at temperatures between 1,200°F and 2,000°F. These temperatures can cause terrible skin burns.

Alternatives to sparklers and safer: glow sticks, ribbons, balloons, and Soap bubbles. Celebrate without the danger of sparklers.

National Hot Dog Month:

Nathan's Famous International Hot Dog Eating Contest is an annual competitive eating event held on July 4th at the original Nathan's Famous restaurant in Coney Island, New York City.

Please, don't encourage a hot dog eating contest, it can be a possible choking hazard.

• Do you know how to help someone who is choking?

• Do you know how to perform the Heimlich maneuver? Join one of our quarterly held CPR classes to learn how.

Hot Sidewalks:

When walking pets during the heat of the day the sidewalks can be very hot. I saw a 'YouTube', of kids were frying an egg on a hot summer sidewalk.

Suggest walking your pets in the early morning or late afternoon when the sidewalks are cooler. I have seen people, who have trained their dogs to wear boots. I never could get my dog to keep them on her feet.

Pet Safety:

• Test the Pavement: Place the back of your hand on the pavement for 7 seconds. If it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your dog's paws. (Note: if you are not flexible, like me, you may need assistance standing back up. Hopefully, your pet will wait.)

A safety suggestion, install a Knox Box. The Knox Box contains your front door house key and can only be opened by the local fire department. Knox Box, there is a cost for the box. (Knoxbox.com/800-552-5669)

GOLF COMMITTEE

Golf Etiquette: Let's Keep Golf Fun for Everyone

Most experienced golfers will tell you that they know all about Golf Etiquette, but I see violations of these basic principles almost every time that I play golf....and when it occurs, it invariably takes a little fun out of that round. Provided below are some of the basic Golf Etiquette tips. Don't hesitate to remind your playing partners when you spot deviations from these principles.

1. **Don't dawdle** – This, of course, refers to "Pace of Play". Following behind a slow foursome is a pet peeve of almost all golfers...so try not to be one of those slow golfers!! Determine your distance and select your club before it is your turn to hit. And then play "Ready Golf", as long as hitting your shot does not disturb another golfer's address of the ball.

Looking for lost golf balls too long can drive other golfers crazy....abide by the new rule of 3 minutes for the search. And if you don't find it (and it is likely out of bounds), the new Rules of Golf allow you to drop a ball on the edge of the fairway and add 2 strokes rather than having to take the time to re-hit the shot by going back to where you took the last stroke (i.e. stroke and distance penalty).

Help others find their errant shots. There should always be at least 2 pairs of eyes on each shot (or preferably 4). This can significantly shorten searches and speed up the game.

Move away from the green promptly after putting out. You can write down the scores when you get to the next tee box.

2. **Clean up after yourself** – Replace or fill divots in the fairway. Don't leave a divot for the next group to land in (or repair). Repair your ball marks on the greens...better yet, if every golfer repaired 2 marks on every green, our greens would stay smooth for everyone! After hitting out of a sand bunker, take the time to rake....leave the sand in the same condition that you found it. Dispose of trash and smoking materials in the nearest trash can, not on the course.

3. **Don't be a distraction** – Stand silently and out of the way when another golfer in your group is

hitting their shot. Never stand in the line of play, either beyond the hole or directly behind the ball. Don't drive up to the next tee when the group ahead is hitting....instead, move your cart away from the green you just played but stop far enough from the tee box not to disturb those teeing off. Don't hit a ball into the group ahead of you...make sure that all golfers in the group ahead are beyond the distance that your ball will likely travel. And if you do hit an errant shot, yell "fore", if there is any possibility that someone could be in the direction that the ball is headed. Finally, turn off your cell phone or set it on vibrate so as not to have it make noise in the middle of someone's swing.

4. Follow all Golf Cart Rules – Never drive the cart on or near tee boxes, greens, bunkers, or water hazards. If a "90 degree rule" is in effect, this means that you should only leave the cart path towards your ball when a 90 degree turn would get you there. And if the rule of the day is CPO (Cart Path Only), this guidance should be followed religiously, because driving off of the path is likely to cause damage to fairways and rough.

Following these tips can go a long way toward keeping golf fun for all participants!

Kathleen Ruth Aust entered eternal life Thursday, May 1, 2025 after a valiant battle with Parkinson's Disease. She was born in Johnstown, PA,

daughter of Louis and Catherine Aust and is now reunited with them. Preceded in death by her parents and 2 brothers, James (deceased), formerly married to Adrienne (DiFrancesco) and Michael, she is survived by 2 sisters and 3 brothers: Mary Agnes, wife of James Roccio; Barbara, married to Thomas Kenefake; Louis, married to Louise (Sherlock; deceased); Paul, formerly married to Lynn (Buchanan); and Charles; five nieces, three nephews; great nieces, great nephews and cousins.

Kath, as her family fondly called her, attended St. Joseph and St. Benedict grade schools. Being in the Brownies and Girl Scouts contributed to developing her organizational skills that proved very valuable in her administrative career as a financial management analyst and a budget and program analyst. Kath was recruited by the federal government while a student at Johnstown Catholic High School (now Bishop McCort), which began her 30 years serving at the Department of Transportation, National Park Service and the Treasury Department. She was proficient at many computer applications and earned six Outstanding Performance Awards during her civil service career. Kath worked in real estate in her spare time and in retirement.

Kath worked as one of the supervisors of the U.S. International Transportation Exposition, also known as Transpo '72, a multi-million-dollar trade show at Dulles International Airport outside Washington, D.C., in May and June of 1972 sponsored by the U.S. Department of Transportation. It served as a showcase for all sorts of transportation technologies. Over a million visitors attended from all over the world. The Wall Street Journal described it as the largest exposition the government held since World War II (details from Wikipedia).

The most notable trait of Kath was her generosity. She was one of the most generous people we know. Her brother Lou called her the "Mother Theresa to people in need." Her vocation to the single life gave her ample time and resources to assist others in all kinds of ways. Kath was a devoted sister to her siblings and especially to her younger brother Michael, helping him fund his technical training, buying a home and obtaining treatment for his health challenges. She co-signed a loan with Chuck to buy a set of drums in 1977 which he used to help produce 2 studio albums with a church friend and still uses to this day in an oldies band.

Kath always looked for ways to contribute to the well-being of others. She served on the board of directors at her condominium in Arlington, VA and was chair of a committee most recently at Heritage Hunt in Gainesville, Virginia, where she lived for 20 years. Kath helped to establish an emergency entry/exit for first responders and emergency vehicles at Heritage Hunt. She trained for and joined a safety team in 2006 called the Community Emergency Response Team, designed to assist first responders during disasters.

Kath was a devout Catholic and attended Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Gainesville prior to moving to Laurel View Village in Davidsville, PA.

Beading and jewelry-making were hobbies for Kath and she would participate in craft shows in Dillweed, PA and at her Heritage Hunt Community Arts and Crafts shows. She was known for these skills and repaired jewelry in an enterprise she called "Sew-Bead-It."
