# JUNE BOARD BRIEFS

#### Summertime and the Livin' Is Easy!

June brings us summertime and easy livin' at Heritage Hunt. But first...

Slow down, we move too fast!!! We've all seen them standing at attention and flashing our speed on Heritage Hunt Drive (HHD near the tee box of hole 17 and HHD-2 going north and on the east side of HHD) and on Arthur Hills Drive. The speed boards show that too many drivers are far exceeding the posted speed limits of 30 mph on HHD and 25 mph on AHD. On HHD by hole #17, 72% of drivers exceeded the 30-mph speed limit; 80 drivers drove faster that 51 mph – 20 mph over the posted speed limit. Likewise, on HHD-2, 89% of drivers drove 31 mph or faster. More than half (52%) of drivers exceeded the 25-mph limit on AHD. It's summertime. Take it easy and slow down!

A fun fact...Heritage Hunt conducts an age verification survey every two years as required by the federal government. Of the 1,863 units within Heritage Hunt, 97% were born on or before March 15, 1970. The average age for residents at Heritage Hunt is 76 years old.

So long, farewell, auf wierdersehen, adieu, adios, sayonara! Prince William Water (PWW) will soon be a memory. Thanks to Rich Crimm, chair of the Grounds Committee and Sandy Painter, Board Liaison to the Grounds Committee for developing the punch list on this project. The finish line for this marathon project is in sight!

Dominion Energy is conducting a series of community meetings to present and gather public feedback on a proposed 36.5-mile transmission line project that would begin in southern Fauquier County and run through Prince William and Loudoun counties. The Morrisville—Wishing Star 500 kV and 230 kV transmission line is part of a larger infrastructure expansion approved in 2023 by PJM Interconnection, the regional transmission organization responsible for coordinating electricity in 13 states and Washington, D.C. The broader initiative aims to upgrade the bulk energy transmission system to meet growing demand across Northern Virginia, West Virginia and Maryland. The preferred

alternative is to double the size of the Pageland power line corridor (taking national park land) but there is considerable pressure to run it near to HH - just a couple hundred feet from Adirondack Court.

After several months, Heritage Hunt legal counsel heard from the Department of Justice (DOJ) relative to the Civil Investigative Demand on the PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan that was applied for in 2020 and forgiven in 2021. CAMP identified a list of several specialized law firms for consideration by the Board of Directors. The Board interviewed three of those law firms with specialty practices in DOJ matters. Crowell and Moring law firm was engaged to represent Heritage Hunt on the PPP loan.

Upcoming excursions include Ain't Too Proud/ The Temptations at the National Theatre on June 17 and Les Miserables on July 10 at the Kennedy Center. Tickets for these excursions go fast, so don't wait to sign up and save your seat on the bus.

CulinArt Updates. Warm up your vocal chords. Karaoke is back! CulinArt heard the Heritage Hunt crooners and warblers missed having their impromptu, informal "choir practice." Join the fun on June 1 in the Great Oak Ballroom. Dads, granddads, and great-granddaddies...watch for announcements about celebrating your special day – Father's Day – on June 15. Chef Ryan and his team are cooking up something special for all of our special dads.

# HERITAGE HUNT FINANCIAL CORNER - Q1 2025

Heritage Hunt experienced mixed financial results during the first quarter of 2025. Performance by HOA operations and Golf exceeded budget expectations while Food and Beverage Hospitality financial results continue to be challenging.

HOA operations produced a surplus of \$90K which is \$39K better than budget. Generally, spending was lower than budget. Snow removal exceed budget by \$39K but was offset by lower repair and maintenance activity. There will be increased repair and maintenance activity during the balance of the year.

Food and Beverage Hospitality incurred a (\$232K) deficit in Q1. Low revenue volume and expense inefficiencies, specifically direct labor, contributed to the deficit. Your Board is actively engaged with CulinArt to discuss challenges and monitor progress. It is forecasted that Q2 revenues will approach \$500K—more than double Q1 revenue. It's worth mentioning that food quality and service continue to improve.

Golf operations exceeded expectations in Q1. Golf produced a surplus of \$80K which is \$120K better than budget. Revenues surpassed the budget on the growth of Platinum (non-resident) members. Lower maintenance staffing helped to contain expenses under budget.

In summary, in Q1 the HOA had a deficit (\$62K) which is (\$73) off the budget. See chart below.

Your Board remains committed to transparency, and strengthening our financial foundation. More to come in our next update!

PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PRESENTATION



The Prince William County Sheriff's Office is happy to present to the Heritage Hunt community, very valuable information about the *Project Lifesaver Program*, as well as the *Senior Safe Program*.

Your presenters will be Master Deputy Kevin Truesdale, who is the Project Lifesaver Program coordinator, and Master Deputy Joshua Thompson, who is the Senior Safe Program coordinator.

Master Deputy Truesdale started his law enforcement career with the City of Alexandria Sheriff's Office. Master Deputy Truesdale later transferred to Prince William Sheriff's Office in 2016. During Master Deputy Truesdale's career, he has served in various positions including working as a jail deputy in the Alexandria Adult Detention Center, Sheriff Office Response Team (S.E.R.T). Served as a bailiff in the Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court for the City of Alexandria Court. During his service with Prince William County, he has served in Courthouse Security, Circuit Court, and the Civil Enforcement Division. Master Deputy Truesdale is currently assigned to the Office of Professional Standards where he is a field training deputy, Project Lifesaver coordinator, drone operator, civil disturbance team coordinator, and holds instructorships in general, firearms, control tactics, and munitions.

Master Deputy Thompson started his law enforcement career with the Manassas City Police Department in 2004 and has been with Prince William County Sheriff's Office since 2015. During that time, Master Deputy Thompson worked every shift as a patrol officer, was a gang detective, and worked on the Special Problems Unit, which is like the Street Crimes Unit at the Prince William County Police Department. When he transitioned to Prince William County Sheriff's Office, Master Deputy Thompson worked in Courthouse Security for a short period of time, then in the Civil Enforcement Division for 9 years.

Currently, Master Deputy Thompson is assigned to the Office of Professional Standards, where he manages the Senior Safe Program, the Gun Safety Program, and field trains lateral transfers and new recruits from the Prince William County Criminal Justice Training Academy.

A question-and-answer period will follow the presentations. The Prince William County Sheriff's Office appreciates the opportunity to speak with our citizens that live in Heritage Hunt.

# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

June, this month's flowers are roses and honeysuckles.

The summer months are here. We are now spending more time driving with the car windows down and enjoying outdoor walks.

Why talk about two totally separate things cars and walking. Because the two should never meet. Only sad things will happen, if they do.

I remember when I was in the boy scouts. We always looked forward to building campfires. One of the many safety drills our leaders would teach us. If your clothes should catch on fire, you were to STOP, DROP, and ROLL on the ground to smother your burning clothes. (I hope this never happens.)

Here is another modified version for people crossing our roads; STOP listening to your music or reading your text messages, DROP your gaze down to the road, ROLL your eyes left and right looking for cars. I am adding a fourth and ASSUME the driver does not see you.



In Virginia cars are legally obligated to stop for pedestrians in crosswalks, whether marked or unmarked. This includes intersections and

mid-block locations. Drivers must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and remain stopped until the pedestrian has cleared the lane.

We don't want anyone living with the pain of physical rehabilitation or anyone living with the nightmare of, if, I only had stopped.



The warm summer weather will bring more families with small children to the pool area and fitness facility. I will be one of them. The roads around these areas

will have more cars parked on the streets. This

will require more caution when we are driving through, so expect to slow down. For those crossing in this area, one word "Jaywalking". I must mention this.

Jaywalk comes from jay walker, coined in Kansas City in 1906, from the sense of jay as an ignorant person. In the early 20th century: from jay in the colloquial sense 'silly person' + walk.

Jaywalking is not completely legal in any state. Virginia decriminalized jaywalking in 2020, meaning that police are no longer permitted to issue citations for it. However, Heritage Hunt has clearly marked crosswalks, please use them.

This month lets slow down and smell the roses.

A safety suggestion for 2025, install a Knox Box on the front of your house. The Knox Box contains your front door house key. The Knox Box can only be opened by the local fire/rescue department. Knox Box, there is a cost for the box. This will save your front door in case of an emergency when rescue people are called.

# CROSSROADS CONNECTION

A year ago, Crossroads had almost 400 students who got food on weekends. Now, we serve 425 kids. Heritage Hunt is one of our biggest supporters, giving us food and money. We're so grateful to our residents who donated! We've also gotten help from generous people like the Carter's Mill community, Women in Construction, UVA Health, and the Virginia Soccer Association. These are just a few of the people who are helping us feed the students.

How do we manage to support more students who need help? We order huge pallets of food from BJs and use coupons to save about \$400 every month. We stretch those dollars as far as we can.

Why do we shop at BJs? Don't food drives give us most of what we need? Nope! All 11 food drives this school year collected 21,000 food items, which is only 10% of the total we need to support 425 kids. Money donations are super important. The money goes to food, except for some small administrative costs. We don't have paid positions because we rely on volunteers. The building rent is paid by Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, who agreed to accept the Crossroads mission a few years ago.

## **GENEALOGY CLUB**



The Genealogy Club will meet on Monday, June 23, at 2 PM in the Mountain View Room of our Clubhouse. At this writing, we have not yet finalized our June program. In the meantime, take

a moment to reflect on how we live today compared with what our ancestors faced in their era.

We all studied history in school, but how much do we know about our own family histories? How our ancestors lived in contrast to our lifestyles today? Genealogy research isn't just a collection of names, dates, events, etc. As we try to make "friends" with our ancestors, it helps if we can picture them in the context of their habitats and life styles. Books, old photos, paintings, descriptions, letters, etc. bring to life the mere names of once-living, real human beings who lived the best way they could, given the era in which they were placed.

In addition, history books, family history centers, historic reenactments, museums, etc. help us envision our forebears. A plethora of books about life in the past, here in America and other parts of the world, also shine light on how our ancestors lived. For example, the first Sears catalog appeared in 1888, and the early catalogs marvelously illustrate what might have been in our ancestors' homes. Online, take a look at www.historyfacts.com.

As our ancestors migrated to new locations by ship, covered wagons, trains, through all kinds of weather and land/water conditions, we are able to explore far-off places comfortably transported via cars, buses, trains, cruise ships, airplanes. We have benefited from the risks and uncertainties our forefathers faced – plus they had no Holiday Inns to rest and recuperate from the day's travels and weather conditions.

If you plan to include genealogy research in your summer travels, be sure to prepare in advance before leaving. In addition, serendipity can play a role in achieving your objectives. I once visited a genealogical library in New Jersey and completed my research objectives with all but one surname — Vanderbelt, which is a common name in that state. I told the librarian that I hadn't been able to find an information folder for that line. "Mental Health is the #1 issue in policing."

Chief Peter Newsham



Prince William County Police Chief, Peter Newsham, was the Keynote speaker at the Giving Circle's Spring Event. Chief Newsham commended the Giving Circle on its work helping families and individuals in need.

- Crime is generally trending downward (in 2009 the rate of crime was 47.4 per 1,000 residents; it was 39.3 in 2024)

The Chief reinforced, what we all know- every dollar given to help those in need in our community counts.

After delivering prepared remarks, the Chief responded to several questions from the audience on a range of diverse topics.

Over the next several months, the Grants Committee will be reviewing the reports of last year's grantees, vetting new grantees recommended by members and analyzing the activities and outcomes proposed in the 2025 applications for this year's grants focused on mental and physical health, housing, food, clothing, and literacy.

# THERE IS ALWAYS ROOM FOR ONE MORE . . .

Fellow residents, does it seem that there are more golfers on the Heritage Hunt (HH) Golf Course (Course) in recent months? Fellow golfers, have you noticed new faces on Course? Both observations are on point as the HH Golf Membership has increased steadily by over 100 members during the past year. The increase can be attributed, in part, to several factors.

One factor is the Course reputation in the area for its playability and condition as confirmed by golfers throughout the State of Virginia who selected HH as the number one course in the Northern Virginia region in 2024 when polled by Virginia Magazine. Another is the coordinated effort of the Pro Shop and the Golf Committee to recruit small groups to play the course intermittently as a social outing to entice these part-time golfers to become full-time HH Course members. A third reason is the membership recruitment efforts of Head Pro John Yancy and Golf Membership Director, Olivia Mann.



When prospective members meet with Olivia, she discusses the different types of memberships available to HH residents and to HH non-residents. She further explains the benefits and options for each type of membership, to

include priority access to tee time reservations and participation in the many men's, women's, and couples' leagues, and the monthly seasonal weekend tournaments. Olivia also advises about the choice between an 18-hole or a 9-hole membership.

We would like to remind you of our New Member Referral Program that extends to existing Golf Members and HH residents who refer a golfer who becomes a new 18-hole or 9-hole member. The referring individual for someone who purchases an 18-hole membership can earn a complimentary golf cart card (20 uses of a golf cart without charge) or a \$500 greens fees pass. For referring someone who purchases a 9-hole membership, the incentive is a \$250 greens fee pass or a cart card (10 uses of a golf cart without charge).



# **HH LITTLE THEATER (HHLT)**



### FOOD SCRAPS RECYCLING IN HERITAGE HUNT

We are all aware that climate change is not a future problem. Changes to earth's climate, driven by increased human emissions of heat-trapping greenhouse gases, are already widespread. We see the effects on the news everyday with devastating weather events becoming worse with each season.

Perhaps you say "I am only one person, what difference can I make". Yet collectively, working together we can make a difference and influence others within and outside of our community to do the same. That is how change happens. We already have recycling bins which the community is using at their homes and we take our bottles to Longwood Park or to nearby recycling centers. Now how about our food wastes?!

As much as 40% of food is wasted and sent to landfills, where it produces methane, a gas that is 84 times worse for the environment than carbon dioxide. We can help by collecting our food scraps at home.

At the Balls Ford Road Yard Waste Compost Facility and other Landfill/Recycling Centers, food waste along with yard waste and other organic material are composted and produced into thousands of tons of compost, topsoil and mulch each year for resale. In nature, nothing is wasted. Let's keep that going.

A shout out to the Green Neighborhood Group who has been keeping us informed by having experts on various environmental subjects address our community. At their May 6th meeting CulinArt talked about kitchen waste. We can make a difference, become more aware and help save this planet for generations to come.

To help us all get started on Recycling Food Waste, Mary Kane has offered her neighbors the opportunity to bring their food scraps, in compostable bags to her house on Thursday mornings and put them in a cooler she provides. She then takes the cooler to the recycling center. Folks keep a compostable bag handy in the kitchen and put their food scraps in it and freeze it. Then

There are two houses in Heritage Hunt to deposit your frozen compostable bags with food scraps in them every Thursday.






