#### **MAY BOARD BRIEFS**

#### May Day to Memorial Day at Heritage Hunt

As we turn the corner to welcome springtime, the Prince William Water force main and pumphouse project is nearing its end. On April 18, Board members Maureen Storey and Sandy Painter, Grounds Committee Chair Rich Crimm, and CAMP staff Marck Rossy and Kirk Wallace, walked with PWW project manager and an Archer Western representative to inspect the grounds surrounding the new pumphouse and elsewhere on Heritage Hunt property. A punch list of items was made that need to be remediated before issuing a notice of substantial completion. We were assured that all of the heavy construction trucks are gone and never to return to the property. This is good news for us all, but especially those living on Alderwood Way and Fieldstone Drive.

The Heritage Hunt roads need a makeover, i.e., milling and repaving. Becht Engineering has been hired to manage this massive project from developing the RFP (request for proposals) to completion. CAMP is developing a communications plan that will keep residents informed about road closures, detours and so forth. Watch for Alerts in the e-Communicator later this summer.

Thanks to our hard-working producers and operators with HH Concerts and LSTV, there is a great line-up of dance parties, retro pop and retro rock concerts, and classical music performances this year. The next concert on May 8 features Catherine Lan and Tao Lin, the husband-and-wife internationally renowned concert pianists, Duo Beaux Arts. Their performance will be in the Great Oak Ballroom with doors opening at 7:00 pm and performance to begin at 7:30 pm. Cash bar will be available. Ticket prices are \$32.

The HH Chorale will regale us in its spring concert with That's Entertainment: Songs from Stage and Screen. Two performances will be held in the Great Oak Ballroom on April 30 at 2 pm and May 1 at 7:30 pm.

And, sponsored by the Community Relations Committee, on May 3, from 9 am to noon, the very talented HH artists and crafters will hold their 2nd annual At Home Art Show. See page 11 for details.

A fan-filled trip to Washington Nationals Park is planned for May 20 to cheer on our own

Washington Nationals who will play against the Atlanta Brayes.

Activities on the golf course and the sports courts have ramped up. Bocce League is on a roll and tennis and pickleball are in full swing. The Crazy 6's golf tournament is scheduled for May 17. Two-person teams play six (6) holes in each of these formats: Scramble, Net Best Ball, and Alternate Shot. The golf course is beginning to take shape after a very tough winter, early and cooler-than-normal fall, and drought conditions last summer when the Tahoma 31 sprigs were laid down. The Board has now approved and signed a golf equipment lease agreement with Landscapes Unlimited Fleet Management that should save the community money.

CulinArt launched its much-anticipated spring menu with popular favorites and new offerings such as pork potstickers and coconut shrimp (Starters); ½ and full portions of spring mix salad with berries and fennel and orange arugula salad; prosciutto Tuscan sandwich and Cuban sandwich (Handhelds); and pan seared mahi mahi and rosemary crusted lamb chops (Entrees). Planning a special Mother's Day on May 11 in the Red Oak Bar and Grill and a Memorial Day picnic on May 26 at the Marsh Mansion are on CulinArt's docket of Resident Events. Maybe you've heard that CulinArt is also offering a Spring Sports Special that is available every day (Tuesday through Sunday) between 11:30 am to 3:00 pm. Get a hot dog, French fries (or chips), and a beer, wine, or soda for \$12; or have a hamburger or cheeseburger, French fries (or chips) and a beer, wine or soda for \$17. A second alcoholic drink is an additional \$3. Due to its popular demand are recurring weekly specials including Taco Tuesday, Shrimp Night Wednesday, Wine Night with Charcuterie on Thursday, Stir Fry-day, Chef's Tasting Menu on Saturdays, and of course, Sunday Brunch.

So, enjoy this month from May Day to Mother's Day to Memorial Day.

## COMMUNITY COMMUNICATIONS

#### WEBSITE TRAINING

The Communications Work Group will conduct another training session on how to access and navigate the Heritage Hunt website on Tuesday, May 6th from 1 to 2:30 PM in the Clubhouse Mountain View Room.

Stay informed with what's happening in the 'hood. Learn about how to access calendars, Board and Committee news, resident directory, restaurant and event information, HOA rules, or manage your club account.

Participants should have Heritage Hunt website log-in credentials. If you do not, you can obtain them beforehand by e-mailing adminassistant@ heritagehunt.net or calling (703) 743-2000, extension 4.

The focus of the session will be to explain and demonstrate how to navigate the website and how to access and use features of most interest to the participants. There will be a handout for participants to keep for future reference.

It is not essential to bring your laptop or tablet, charging cord and mouse; unless participants prefer hands-on instruction.






"THE FIGHTING AT MANASSAS AND THE ROBINSON FAMILY"



Here in Heritage Hunt, we are fortunate to be very close to the site of the Battle of Manassas, the first major battle of the American Civil War. Tyler McGraw, a historian and a student of the Civil War for over 10 years, will bring to us the story of Jim Robinson, a free African American during the Civil War here in Manassas. His home was on Henry Hill which saw tremendous fighting during both the first and second battles of Manassas. Mr. McGraw will cover the fighting at Manassas, the experiences of the Robinson Family and what happened to the family after the Civil War.

Mr. Tyler McGraw was born in Leesburg, Virginia. His fascination with the Civil War and 19th century history began at an early year. ## COMMUNITY ADVOCACY GROUP

The Community Advocacy Group (CAG) will meet on Thursday, May 22nd at 4 PM in the Clubhouse Craft Room (lower level).

CAG was established in May, 2024 "to inform and interact with Heritage Hunt residents on issues where civic engagement is essential."

You may have heard of discussions regarding options for improving our community's financial health. One CAG member referred me to consultant recommendations made over eight years ago, which are still available on the Heritage Hunt website at: https://www.heritagehunt.net/Files/Library/STM\_HH\_MASTER\_PLAN\_FINAL\_REPORT\_28FEB17.PDF. Before our decision-makers re-plow the same ground, it may be useful to review prior recommendations that were not implemented. For example, one previous recommendation with current validity is:

• "To address the need of improving revenue, particularly food and beverage, we recommend the testing of an F&B minimum fee, built into the current monthly dues payment, not as a dues increase. Here a modest amount could be designated as a monthly credit in the club facilities. It would encourage residents who do not use the facilities at all to try them out, and infrequent users to become more regular users. It would also serve as a "reward" and recognition of current, frequent users of the facility."

You will have the opportunity to express your views in a food & beverage survey to assess community desires. CAG will provide our assistance in promoting the consensus recommendation and eliciting community support for it.

CAG also supports "outside the gates" efforts to protect our community. CAG will sponsor another Bingo fundraiser (to support the legal defense fund challenging the Prince William Digital Gateway) on May 21st at 1 PM in the Clubhouse Ballroom. Show your support, have some fun, and win cash prizes.

#### **GENEALOGY CLUB**

The Genealogy Club will meet on Monday, May 19, at 2 PM in the Clubhouse Mt. View Room. This date is the third Monday, not our usual fourth Monday. Thus, be sure to mark your calendars for May 19! Our program will be a video titled "Scottish Family History Research: Beyond the Basics," by Maureen Brady.

Many of us who have English ancestry are likely to also have forebears from Scotland. This video will discuss Scotland in general and also the variety of records that can be researched and where to find them, including the internet. Maureen Brady places an emphasis on records other than the usual church, civil, and census documents.

By this month, you may have begun thinking about genealogy-related summer road trips. Careful planning is essential for achieving your goals on these trips. Be sure you know where the ancestor had lived (at least the area), details of his/her life that you've already been able to uncover, addresses, local libraries, museums, and genealogy-related repositories in the research area. Knowing the names of the neighbors who lived near your ancestor can be helpful, so be sure to include their names in your research. Church and census records that you already possess can be helpful.

What to bring with you on a genealogy-related trip: Information you already have about your ancestor. Your driver's license, which may be needed for identification in various facilities.

Your phone and/or camera for taking photos of information accessed during your trip.

Notebooks or tablets for jotting down essential information, locations, and other details.

Folders for the info you already have on the ancestor(s).

Paper clips, scotch tape, ruler, and pencils/pens galore for the inevitable note-taking in libraries, museums, etc.

Flashlight for help in areas that aren't well lit, faded manuscripts and photographs, walking around at twilight, etc.

We genealogists love to hear stories about ancestral sleuthing. Learning about who is in our DNA can help us better understand ourselves or our living relatives. #### **GOLF HANDICAP**

#### GOLF LIFE INTERRUPTED; HANDICAP DISRUPTED



In January, Heritage Hunt Golfer and Thespian, Billy Clay (pictured), helped construct sets for a production at the Vint Hill Theater. While backing down the aisle to view his progress, Billy's foot caught under a chair and he found himself spinning and falling. Billy's landing on a theater seat's sturdy wooden armrest resulted in 3 broken ribs and a punctured lung.

After 3 hospitalizations and lung surgery, Billy is back home, healing, and able to get around with-out too much discomfort. And he is hopeful the doctor gives him clearance soon to swing a golf club and possibly begin to "carefully" play golf by late April or so.

Quite naturally, Billy is concerned that when he returns to golf his **Handicap** will no longer represent his golfing ability as he recovers from his injuries. And yet he wants to return to competitive League play and to play in Tournaments as soon as it's safe to do so.

A golf **Handicap** is a numerical measure of a golfer's ability, used to level the playing field and allow golfers of different skill levels to compete fairly. It works well under normal circumstances, but when serious injury or surgery has made it impossible to play for a prolonged period, it may no longer be a good match for a golfer's current ability. Fortunately, **Rule 7.1 of the Rules of Handicapping** allows an adjustment to be made.

If a notable injury or illness happens to you, contact your **Handicap Sub-Committee** and explain your situation. Based on a few new rounds, your Handicap can be Modified and temporarily marked with an "M." Your scores will be monitored for a while to determine if the Modification should become permanent (as if you've begun a new handicap) or temporary (using all your scores, before and after the injury).

Just like before your injury, it is important that you post your scores to GHIN each time you play

a round. With each round posted, your Handicap gets better and better at predicting your true current scoring ability.

Your Handicap Sub-Committee, Mary Ide, Bettie Layman, Jerry Manley, Ed Cook, Joan Patton, Pat Barrett, is always ready to help with this or any Handicap question.

# **TEARS - JON WILSKA**



Jon Wilska, 80, of Gainesville, VA, died on March 13, 2025. Though dementia impacted his life fairly significantly over the past several years, he never lost his kindness or his good-naturedness.

Born on March 10, 1945, in West Springfield, MA, Jon lived a rich, full life, and was many things: a son, a brother, a husband of nearly 55 years to Mary, an incredible father to his son Greg and daughter Emily, the most loving Poppa to his two cherished granddaughters, Kate and Avery, and a devoted family member and friend to many.

Jon strongly believed in and valued both learning and teaching. He got his BA from Bates College in 1967, his Master's from Boston University in 1972, and his 6th-year from Central Connecticut State University in 1983. He was a public school teacher for nearly 40 years, mostly in the Old Saybrook, CT, school system. Jon was a proud member of the Connecticut Education Association (CEA) and the Old Saybrook Education Association, where he also served as President for several years.

In 1999, Jon and Mary moved from their longtime home in Niantic, CT, to North Stonington, where they transformed a 1760 Colonial farmhouse into a successful bed and breakfast, the Inn at Lower Farm. While he was still teaching, Jon pitched in on evenings and weekends and during the summer; after his retirement, he shifted his focus to the inn full time, and together he and Mary welcomed hundreds of guests from around the world for 15 years.

Jon lived a life of service, volunteering for many years with the Interfaith Refugee Resettlement Committee in southeastern Connecticut, with Habitat for Humanity throughout New England and, when Hurricane Katrina hit in 2005, with the Red Cross, traveling down to the Gulf Coast to pitch in on recovery efforts.

In 2019, Jon and Mary moved to Virginia to be closer to their son and his family, settling in

Heritage Hunt. Jon was active in a number of clubs and activities, including bocce, as a three-year member of the Bocce Ninjas; the woodworking and billiards clubs; and golf, participating in the men's league on Tuesdays for four years. In addition, he enjoyed regularly attending events at the clubhouse, especially musical performances.

Jon leaves behind his wife Mary; son Greg and his wife Sara and daughters Kate and Avery; daughter Emily and her partner Vaughn; sister Charlene; brother Eric and his wife Evelyn; dozens of other beloved family members; and a wide community of friends and neighbors.




