SEPTEMBER BOARD BRIEFS

Here comes September and as we move into fall there is much going on (as usual) at Heritage Hunt. Two notable events are the Community Yard Sale the weekend of 9/7- 9/8 and then the Heritage Charity Classic Cancer Walk on 9/28. In between we will see the closing of the outdoor pool but the opening of the newly re-grassed golf course.

The Board, with the assistance of the Golf Committee, has been reviewing proposals from 5 Golf Course firms. There will be an Executive Session with the finalists on September 9th, with the Board determining who gets the contract by September 13th. The firm selected will start at Heritage Hunt 01/01/25. In the meantime, the current vendor UTP is monitoring the new re-grassing and running our Pro shop and Golf Course. A grand reopening is planned in September and more details will follow. This will be a great fun event for the community and an opportunity for current non-golfers to consider the game.

Our Food Service vendor CulinArt has been here almost 3 months and what a difference in that amenity. The new menus are really great and the restaurant can get rather full many nights so make those reservations or use our popular curbside option. We do plan that both of our Club Service vendors will coordinate on many events for community enjoyment.

And speaking of Community and Prince William Water (PWW), the Board does meet with them at least once a month and our General Manager nearly every day. PWW is very much aware that their timing has gone over what was expected, especially as they did the needed work on Golf Course Hole #14 as well as the 24" force main line on Heritage Hunt Drive. They did work to make that time up and are now finishing the new pump station, adding landscaping and setting up punch lists of what needs to get done/finished and when. We will continue to update the community as we get more exact dates.

September is also the start of the "election" season here at Heritage Hunt. We were very pleased with the turnout at the Meet the Board, Meet the Committees on August 30. We certainly hope the interest we had at the meeting carries over into Declaration of Candidacy which starts Sept. 9th and ends October 11th. We will have a Meet the Candidates session on Friday, November 1 at 10 am as voting will start on Monday, November 4th and end at 5 pm at the Annual meeting Tuesday, December 3rd, WE NEED VOLUNTEERS! WE NEED YOUR EXPERTISE! HELP US LIVE- PLAY- THRIVE at Heritage Hunt.

The following resolutions were reviewed at the 7/25 Board meeting. However, due to Horn publication dates, they are appearing here a month late. For a fast review, go to the website and read the meeting minutes that will be there within 2 weeks of the meeting.

- Approved revisions as modified to Policy Resolution #8 - use of Lots, Dwelling Units and Common Areas *see note below for synopsis of revisions
- Approved a Preventive Maintenance Contract for Kitchen Equipment with Day X Night X Day in an amount not to exceed \$8,000 a year
- Approved \$1200 funding from Reserves for replacement umbrellas at the outdoor pool and Clubhouse Knoll.
- Approved changes to the 2024 Budgeted Repair/ Replacement Reserve and the Road Infrastructure Reserve
- Approved the purchase and posting of signs to announce the grand reopening of the Golf Course for play after regrassing is completed.

NOTE PR # 8. Revisions include combining all signs into one section, allowing additional bags for trash pickup of items too large for the standard container, revising how leases must be done and added a section of correct display of flags particularly the American Flag. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

September is National Preparedness Month, and the Heritage Hunt Emergency Preparedness Committee (HH EPC) would like to take this opportunity to remind all residents to prepare for disasters.

Your preparations may make the difference between life and death. It is ultimately our own responsibility.

The acronym RNA is used in Emergency Preparedness to:

R – GET READY, N – GET NOTIFIED and to A – TAKE ACTION.

R - GET READY

- Stay informed of threats from weather, hazards, terrorism, power outages, and gas leaks.
- Make your family plan, places to meet, communications, safe rooms and evacuation plan. Including plans for pets.
- Plan for family with special needs. This includes medical devices and power backup for medical devices.
- Have a three-day emergency supply kit. This kit should include One gallon of water per person, per day. Non-perishable foods, utensils, medications, batteries, flashlights, battery-operated lanterns, first aid kit, toiletries, cell phones and chargers. It is also a good idea to invest in a NOAA weather radio. Also, include cash, medical and financial documents in case of evacuations.
- It is very important to update your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors. It is NOT enough to change out the batteries. You need to change out the whole smoke alarm every 7-10 years. Also, be sure you have CO detectors that are up to date as well. Do not leave it to chance....... an old smoke alarm is NO good! It will not protect your life and the lives of your family. UPDATE NOW!!! There should be one smoke alarm on every level of the home and inside and outside each sleeping area.
- FILE OF LIFE is a way to communicate your medical needs to the first responders. It is so important that the people taking care of your medical needs know your medical history and the

medications you are taking. You may not be able to communicate with them. Our emergency responders know to look on the refrigerator to find these. So please set up your free File of Life. If you do not have one, please see the Front Desk at the Clubhouse.



- Free, Quarterly CPR classes are held here for residents (check the HORN for upcoming classes). Please arm yourself with these lifesaving skills. Remember, you are NOT liable when performing these lifesaving techniques.
- Sign up for local Emergency Prince William County alerts at www.pwcgov.org/pwcan

N - NOTIFIED

- Seek and help disseminate valid, accurate information.
- Listen/watch the HH T-Communicator, weather stations and radios.
- If you have signed up for the emergency PWC alerts, you will get accurate updated information that you can share with neighbors.

A - ACTION

- For Fire, medical or police: Call 911.
- Follow emergency direction from your county authorities.
- Follow your family plan, do not panic.
- Take care of yourselves and family first, then help neighbors.

Most importantly, ensure your safety, Do Not become a victim.

In early August I had the pleasure of getting to know two key CulinArt staff leading the effort to reimagine our Red Oak Bar and Grill, Ryan Farrell and Nirav Desai. ARTWORK FOR THE CLUBHOUSE

Choosing artwork for our beautiful Clubhouse lobby has taken a long time and much consideration because Facilities has a limited budget for accessories, and we wanted to make sure that we spent the funds wisely and made excellent choices which suited the new look.

The very first art we hung was the display in the Blue Ridge hallway showing historic maps of Virginia, symbols of the state bird, flower, and tree, even the state butterfly! We intended to continue the theme and select artwork for the lobby showing more about the regions of Virginia.

Eventually we made a start and chose the triptych for over the sectional, which really fit well in color and shape with a mixture of wood from the trees and just enough bits of color to make it interesting. The size fits the sectional so well. It is perfect! We love it!

The next challenge was to find two different pieces of art, one for each of the lobby stairway walls. Advice from experts said they should not be identical, but should have a relationship to each other, while blending in with the triptych pieces. I would imagine that we looked at 10,000 or more possibilities. We sat in the lobby staring at the walls while looking at possibilities on a computer; we asked friends and complete strangers for their opinions, we talked to the experts in the fine arts group, contracted the photo club for help. Thank you to all of you who so generously offered your advice! You helped more than you know!

Most shades of green do not mix well with the blues and grays of the furniture and carpet. Yellows don't work at all! The gorgeous mountain top vistas looked dark. Architectural scenes just did not look right...too much brick and red in older Virginia buildings and too much gray in newer ones. While we expected majestic blue skies and clouds would be suitable, blues seemed bland and that also eliminated the prominent river artwork of the James and Potomac. Lovely magnolias looked dull. Somehow, farm scenes of the Piedmont or Shenandoah Valley didn't suit the new lobby and beach scenes just looked out of place.

We have finally taken the plunge and ordered the two pieces of art for the stairway walls. I am not going to tell you what they are! You'll just have to wait and see, but they should be here by the time you read this. Please sit in one of the comfortable areas of our lobby and enjoy the space (and maybe a glass of wine?) and think how far we have come!

Facilities will still be adding additional accessories including a mirror over the chest by the sectional. With the remaining accessories budget, we hope to put some permanent furniture in the Blue Ridge Room and lower lobby. The thought is to continue the VA theme in the Blue Ridge and Mountain View Rooms. It seems natural that images from the other Virginia regions should be in rooms named after them!

Hard work? YOU BET! But it was fun, too, and the results really give you a feeling of accomplishment! But we're not done yet!



The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) is the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness. NAMI PW received a grant from the *Giving Circle* in 2023 to help support their *Youth and Family Mental Health Awareness and Education* program. Two components of the program are:

- 1. The *Children's Challenging Behaviors* workshops focusing on helping caregivers distinguish between typical childhood behaviors and those that may require intervention and...
- 2. **Ending the Silence** presentations that raise awareness of warning signs of a mental health condition or a potential suicide, how to help a friend or family member, and how to approach a crisis.



On April 24, *The Giving Circle of Heritage Hunt* invited Pat Victorson, President of NAMI PW, to give a presentation about the successes of NAMI PW's programs and the difference our grant made in the lives of those who were helped. Quotes

In 2023, *The Giving Circle of Heritage Hunt* awarded \$91,700 to 17 different local charities, one of which was NAMI PW. GOLF COMMITTEE NEWS

GOLF ETIQUETTE 101 PART II

In the June edition of the Heritage Horn, Golf Etiquette 101 part I, we discussed the idea of adopting some of the more formal golf etiquette practices.

Now, as the course progresses towards re-opening for play, and golfers are eager to get back to play, it would be helpful to review that information. There are also golf etiquette practices regarding pace of play to include:

- Writing your scores down on the next tee box if golfers are waiting in fairway.
- Parking your cart/golf bag on the side of the green towards the next hole.
- Being ready to play when it's your turn. Don't sit in the cart while your playing partner is hitting. Get out and go to your ball, figure out what club you want to hit, and be ready when it's your turn.
- Playing forward, you'll score better and have more fun!
- Limiting the amount of time spent at the turn (between holes 9 and 10). Or let the group behind you play through.
- Limiting practice swings to 2. You'll be surprised at how much time practice swings adds to a round of golf and how much energy a golfer can conserve by not taking 3-4 additional swings before each shot.
- If your group is walking and there are 3 or 4 of you, If you're in a foursome, and group is struggling to keep the-pace-of play; consider sending the first person to put out to the next tee box. Send the second to put out to the next tee box as well, if you still need to gain a little time. The second to last person to put out gets the flag. This practice can save 30 minutes in an 18 hole round. It's also the practice used by the American Junior Golf Association to maintain their impressive pace of play standards
- If you think you might not be able to find your tee shot and it would demand a "retee," go ahead and take a provisional shot so you don't have to walk back to the tee.

Any golfer, especially those new to the game and high handicappers, can feel free to play by their own drop rules in a casual round of golf with nothing on the line. The rules of golf can get complicated, but if you're new to the game, I'd recommend just dropping a ball where you think your ball went out of bounds and add a penalty stroke to your score. This won't necessarily allow you to keep an 'official' score, but you can still get a sense of how you're improving if always following your same 'rules.' Once you've developed your game, you can start strictly adhering to the official rules.

Finally, help others find their ball.

When playing in a group with other golfers, help them find their ball if yours is further than theirs or they're next to hit. You should also help look for where other players' shots travel when they hit them. Two pairs of eyes are always better than one.

It's easy to get wrapped up in our own games while on the golf course. We may be having a great time with our friends and not realize the group behind us has been waiting on every shot for 3 holes. As golfers, we have to do a better job of being aware of our surroundings and putting ourselves in others' shoes.



HH HIKING CLUB

Although the temperatures are still in the 90's and most of us are staying inside in the comfort of our air-conditioned homes, it's time to focus on getting outside to enjoy some exercise as the days turn cooler and fall colors begin to appear. The HH Hiking Club offers the perfect way to ease into the new season with both local hikes and some that are farther afield. We will begin our fall hiking season in mid-September with the first hike to take place right in our own backyard in the Conway Robinson State Forest.



Did you know that this forest is a 440-acre woodland oasis in our suburban area? The forest provides a blend of mature and immature hardwoods, pine plantations, rare plants and wildflowers. According to the website, some individual mature oak trees are more than 250 years old, dating back to the site's earliest settlement and cultivation in small farms.

Several streams are found on the property, and Little Bull Run bounds the forest on the north. A rock outcrop overlooking Little Bull Run may have provided shelter to Native Americans.

The property became a state forest in 1938, deeded by the Conway Robinson Memorial Park Association in memory of the late Conway Robinson. There was considerable reluctance in accepting the property, due to the belief that no one would ever use it. At the time of the gift, Route 29 was a single-track dirt road that was difficult to traverse, particularly in wet weather. How things have changed!

If you are new to Heritage Hunt or are just looking for a change in your routine, hiking with a group of like-minded individuals is a great way to make new friends, boost happiness, and build bone density without going to the gym. The northern Virginia area offers numerous trails of all degrees of difficulty, so we try to mix it up with a hiking schedule that can be enjoyed by the new as well as the experienced hiker. I would like to welcome our newest member, Bob (Ski). It turns out he likes to dabble in video editing and production. He should fit right in.

Under the stewardship of Mary Collins, it was posted, "what more can we be doing for our community". Meaning, with this incredibly brilliant and creative group of people we have at LSTV, how can we help solve some of our more vexing issues? One of those issues is how to get more people involved in our community. Things like concerts, restaurants, committees and groups would assuredly benefit.

Note: I said restaurants above because if we can show we will use it, Culinart has proposed reopening the Tavern Snack Bar at Marsh Mansion.



Herluf Gyde Lund III (Gyde) peacefully passed away on July 6, 2024 at the age of 85 at his home in Heritage Hunt, in the company of loved ones.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 60 years, Dora; his children, Daniel (Jan), James (Diana), and Katherine

(Marc) Blondin of Manassas, VA; his siblings, Judy Williams, Jerry Lund and John Bryan and their families. He was preceded in death by his infant son, Christopher, sister Barbara Stephenson, and parents, Eugene Lund and Edith Bryan.

Born in St. Louis, Missouri Gyde's passion for nature and the woods was evident from a young age. After high school, he joined Army ROTC, and earned a Bachelors of Science in Forest Management from Utah State University. Upon serving two years of active duty in the US Army in Germany as an Imagery Interpretation Officer, he married Dora in her home country of Costa Rica.

While employed as a civil servant, and raising a young family, Gyde earned a Masters of Science in Forest Fire Sciences and Remote Sensing from the University of Washington.

Gyde went on to have an illustrious career with the Bureau of Land Management, and US Forest Service, where he worked in nearly every aspect of forest inventory; from being a crew member in the Alaska wilderness to heading up the timber inventories on national forest parks. As an expert in his field, Gyde authored more than 150 publications on the subject of forest inventory in remote sensing. He was a mentor to many and shared his knowledge with peers around the world. After retiring, he served as a consultant on significant projects for the United Nations Environment Programme, the International Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), and other international organizations. He was honored with a lifetime achievement award presented by the University of Washington in 2000, and with an official recognition for his contributions to the work of the IPCC, which was bestowed with a Nobel Peace Prize in 2007.



In his personal life, Gyde was humble and introverted - a keen observer of the world, who found true joy in the small pleasures of life. He was the type of person who preferred an old rustic cabin in the woods to a glitzy hotel; a chuckwagon dinner, reminiscent of the Old Wild West than to dining at a Michelin-rated restaurant; and the serenity of a ponderosa pine forest in the mountains to the hustle and bustle of the big city. Gyde possessed a sharp wit and dry humor. He often displayed his love for friends and family by cooking and sharing delicious meals with them. St. Louis style BBQ ribs were his specialty. He travelled the world with Dora for work and pleasure, and shared their adventures with others via lovingly created reports and slideshow presentations.

To maintain a bond with nature in retirement, and share this enthusiasm with others, Gyde enjoyed the hobby of handcrafting walking sticks out of the local forest dead wood and selling them at the Heritage Hunt craft shows. He was often found at the clubhouse pool every morning swimming laps to keep in shape, part of an unofficial swim team with other early risers. With Dora, Gyde loved taking part of the yearly charity walks through the Heritage Hunt neighborhood. Always looking forward to new charity walk shirt designs, as a 21 year resident of Heritage Hunt, he had quite the collection!

His legacy is one of dedication and kindness, a deep love for his family, and a hope of harmony for mankind. A beloved husband, father, brother, and accomplished forester, Gyde will always be remembered and greatly missed.

A private dinner will be held to honor Gyde's life, per his wishes. In lieu of flowers the family kindly requests that a tree be planted in Gyde's memory, but no doubt he'd prefer a forest.






